

CHATEAU FLORIE AUDE

BORDEAUX Rouge (Red)



Ownership & history:

Owner and winemaker Daniel Brulatout named this estate after his two daughters, Florie and Aude. His quest for high quality wine has been a success story, and he has been able to expand the vineyard from a mere 7 hectares in 1981 to 77 hectares today.

Vineyard & location:

The estate is situated in the picturesque village of Aubie-Espessas, on the right bank of the Dordogne, not far from Fronsac. The soil is heavy in limestone with some clay and silica too.

Harvest, vinification & ageing:

The vinification is carried out in a mixture of stainless steel and cement vats. 30% of the wine is aged in oak barrels.

Tasting:

The wine is a deep purple colour. On the nose, it shows ripe forest fruits, and the mouth is medium- to full-bodied. It pairs very well with hard cheeses such as Comté and red meats.

Blend:

85% Merlot
15% Cabernet
Sauvignon

Up to 6 years
