

CHATEAU PICOURNEAU MALVEZIN

HAUT-MEDOC Rouge (Red)



Ownership & history:

The name of the PICOURNEAU locality appears in a document dated from the XVIth century. The buildings which constitute the current estate were erected in 1771, and were exclusively dedicated to wine activity up until the tragic episode of Phylloxera in 1865.

It's in 2013 that Jean-Dominique CANALE undertook to return Château Picourneau, property of his parents since 1967, to its original purpose as a winery.

Vineyard & location:

The PICOURNEAU estate is located in the vicinity of some of the most famous and prestigious communal Appellation in Medoc, Saint-Estèphe and Pauillac.

Harvest, vinification & ageing:

Grapes are collected at the optimum maturity exclusively manually, two sorting hand processes are performed in the vineyard and at the cellar to eliminate non quality elements. The harvest follows traditions typical of the Medoc area. Wine is immediately transferred to oak barrels after alcoholic fermentation for a period up to 18 months.

Tasting:

This vintage aged in French oak barrels will reveal its ruby color dark fruit and spice, gentle tannins and a smooth, bright and fruity finish.
