BORDEAUX SUPERIEUR Rouge (Red)



Ownership & history:

This estate has belonged to the family Bessette since 1971. Jean-Paul, Alice and their son Mathieu produce a wine full of character. Their wine is a perfect representation of the family and generosity of this nice family.

Vineyard & location:

The vineyard is located in Landerrouat, in the far east of Bordeaux, at the frontier of the vineyard of Bergerac. The soil is a chalky-clayey mix, which makes a very well-balanced and fine wine.

Harvest, vinification & ageing:

Winemaking is made specifically for every grape variety, in order to fit to their characteristic. This Bordeaux Supérieur is the result of a fine blending between several grape varieties from different soils. The ageing is partly carried out in barrels, which are an unusual 400 litre size, in order to get a subtle oaking of the wine.

Tasting:

The wine is a deep red colour with garnet tints. There are black fruit aromas with a touch of vanilla from the barrel ageing. In the mouth, the wine is supple, supported by gentle, round tannins. It goes well with white meats and, of course, with cheese.
