

2018 Domaine Valeta Sunny Slope

OVERVIEW

With caves tunneling deep into a vine-covered ridge in the Santa Cruz Mountains and vineyards so steep they have to be farmed with a unique, specially-designed tractor moved by cables, Clos de la Tech is one of the most ambitious and innovative Pinot Noir producers in California. The winery was established in 1994 and continues to be operated by TJ Rodgers, founder and retired CEO of Cypress Semiconductor, and his wife, Valeta. Some of the highlights at Clos de la Tech include extreme growing conditions, high-altitude terrain, vine-by-vine farming, high-density planting (4,150 vines per acre), low yields, innovative equipment, gravity-flow winery, whole cluster fermentations with native yeast, and no filtration.

VINEYARD

Clos de la Tech's five Pinot Noirs come from three estate vineyards: Domaine du Docteur Rodgers, Domaine Valeta, and Domaine Lois Louise. Planted in 1999, **Domaine Valeta** sits on a mountaintop in the Santa Cruz Mountains, 2,350 feet above the Silicon Valley. It is a challenging site that endures wind, cold and the occasional snow. Of the property's 30 acres, only 3.5 acres are planted to vines. The soils are a mix of fractured weathered sandstone and sandy loam, and the clones include 113, 114, 115 and 777.

WINE MAKING

The fruit was hand-harvested between September 8th and September 27th, 2018. After a 5-day cold soak, the grapes underwent traditional vinification methods including foot crushing, whole cluster fermentation with native yeast, malolactic fermentation on lees and gravity transfer (no pumping). The wine was aged in François Frères barrels (Bertrange Forest) for 18 months and bottled unfiltered.

TASTING NOTES

We call Domine Valeta "Sunny Slope" our "delicate, fragrant Burgundian wine." Domaine Valeta tasting notes from Ron Wiegand: (*****) "Nose: Intense, refined, and complex, with aromas of vanilla, cigar tobacco, black cherry, blackberry, cedar, and oak. <u>Palate:</u> Supple, full bodied, and rich, with well-integrated fruit and oak flavors, and a long, full finish. Quite young yet; and likely at its best after 2026, and into 2030s. <u>Summary:</u> An intense and stylish wine, with terrific depth."
