

CHATEAU LA ROSE TRIMOULET

Saint-Emilion Grand Cru



Ownership & history:

The Brisson family has owned and managed Château La Rose Trimoulet since the 18th century. The estate is ideally located just north of the historic village of Saint-Émilion, in the immediate vicinity of some of the region's most prestigious classified growths.

Vineyard & location:

Jean-Claude Brisson manages a 5-hectare vineyard planted across three distinct soil types: sandy-clay with iron-rich subsoils, clay-limestone, and limestone sandy-clay. This soil diversity contributes to the wine's complexity, balance, and overall quality.

Harvest, vinification & ageing:

Following a carefully sorted harvest, the grapes undergo cold maceration to gently extract color, tannins, and aromatic compounds, contributing to a refined and rounded profile. After vinification, the wine is aged in French oak barrels for 12 months, enhancing structure and complexity.

Tasting:

This Saint-Émilion wine displays great elegance and balance, with perfectly integrated oak that enhances complexity without overpowering the fruit. Cabernet Franc brings freshness, aromatic lift, and structure, while Merlot adds roundness, depth, and a smooth, velvety texture. A wine of great class, it fully lives up to its Saint-Émilion Grand Cru designation.
